Definitions

Health Insurance: is a type of insurance coverage that pays for medical and surgical expenses. Health insurance can pay you back for expenses, or they can pay the health care provider directly.

Health Care provider: The doctor or medical professional that provides services.

Deductible: The amount you owe for covered health care services before your health insurance or plan begins to pay.

Copayment: An amount you pay as your share of the cost for a medical service or item, like a doctor’s visit. Often, you pay this when you arrive at your appointment.

Premium: The amount you pay for your health insurance or plan each month.

All Washington Apple Health managed care plans must cover these standard basics:

- * **Hospitalization** – A stay in the hospital, including inpatient surgery and recovery
- * **Emergency Services** – Visits to the emergency room, including ambulance services or treatment at an urgent care facility
- * **Ambulatory Services** – Doctor visits when you’re sick or injured, or outpatient clinic visits
- * **Prescription drugs** – Medicine you doctor orders
- * **Laboratory services** – X-Rays, MRIs, blood tests, etc.
- * **Maternity and newborn care** – For women who need prenatal care or help with pregnancy, complications and delivery
- * **Pediatric services, including oral and vision care** – Dental check-ups, routine eye doctor visits, eyeglasses, immunizations, and more.
- * **Preventative and wellness services, including chronic disease management** – Screening tests for things like osteoporosis and mammograms, and help living with long-term illnesses like diabetes.
- * **Mental health and substance use disorder services, including behavioral health.**
- * **Rehabilitative services and devices** – Physical therapy, speech therapy, artificial limbs and other medical equipment.
- * **Habilitative services and devices*** – Helping people with disabilities learn life skills.
