When Alexander left <u>Syracuse University</u> she was the team's all-time leader in points (2,024), blocks (350), field goals (736), free throws made (552), free throws attempted (750) and games played (140).^[1] She became the second player from Syracuse to be selected in a WNBA Draft.

Professional career

WNBA

Alexander was drafted with the eighth pick in the <u>2013 WNBA Draft</u> by the <u>San Antonio Stars</u>. Since her rookie season, she's been a reserve center on the <u>Stars'</u> roster and a key contributor in rebounding. In the 2016 season, she averaged career-highs in scoring and rebounding with 8.0 points per game and 4.5 rebounds per game. In 2017, Alexander re-signed with the Stars in free agency.^[3]

On February 1, 2018, Alexander was traded by the re-branded <u>Las Vegas Aces</u> along with a third-round pick in the 2019 WNBA Draft to the <u>Indiana Fever</u> in exchange for their second-round selection in the 2019 WNBA Draft.^[4]

Overseas

In the 2015-16 WNBA off-season, Alexander played in <u>Russia</u> for <u>Spartak Vidnoe Moscow Region</u>. In August 2016, Alexander signed a short-term deal with <u>CJM Bourges Basket</u> of the <u>French League</u> for the 2016-17 WNBA off-season. ^[5]

Personal life

Alexander said she wanted to become a teacher once she retires from basketball.^[6] Her brother, <u>Kyle</u> plays for the Miami Heat.
